## Youth4Water Plus at the UN Water Conference 2023!



The United Nations 2023 Water Conference was held at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 22-24 March 2023.

The Conference brought together world leaders, civil society, business leaders, young people, scientists, academics, the UN System and others from across different sectors: agriculture, energy, environment and water around a common goal: to urgently tackle the water crisis and set the world back on track to achieving.

"The commitments at this Conference will propel humanity towards the water-secure future every person on the planet needs" noted UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres at the closing ceremony.

Many Side Events were organized in this UN Water Conference, 185 Side Events inside the HQ; 165 Outside the HQ and 180 Virtual Side Events.

Youth4Water Plus advocate participated in the United Nations Assembly, General youth constituency events, UNICEF led events and some events organized by Bangladesh, Netherland and Tajikistan water ministry. The Main Topics of Discussion were United Nations Joint SDG Fund (Water Blue Economy the role of the UN Joint SDG Fund); Enhancing water resiliency in food systems through water stewardship.

### # Our Environment needs Help!

Youth Environmental Helper, an NGO from Balasore, had organized plogging activities in various tourist destinations of Balasore and beach cleaning activities at Chandipur sea beach.



Environmental believes in the concept of Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle. They have helped about 15 local communities to understand the importance of waste segregation and waste management. Thev also contributed in cleaning and waterbodies restoring around religious places.

Youth Environmental Helper educated more than 200 learners about the benefits of waste segregation, waste management, and how waste can be segregated efficiently at the domestic level.



They also educated communities on how waste management and proper handling of plastic waste can save our environment. With support from Youth4Water Plus, they further understood importance of plogging and that it is one way to mitigate climate change by collecting waste plastic and recycling the same.

### # From Endangered to Thriving: How Community efforts saved the Olive Ridley Turtles?

In a joint effort to protect the endangered Olive Ridley Turtle species, the Sattvic Soul Foundation and Youth4Water Plus organized a "turtle walk" at Podampeta Beach in Ganjam, Odisha.



The walk, led by Satyabrata Samal, the Director & Founder of Sattvic Soul Foundation popularly known as the 'Climate Man of Odisha', aimed to safeguard the eggs and new hatchlings of the Olive Ridley Turtles, which are currently listed as endangered on the IUCN Red List.

Podampeta Beach, situated near the mouth of the Rushikulya River, is considered one of the most important sites for Olive Ridley Sea turtles nesting in India.

The walk was conducted to raise awareness about the importance of protecting the nesting grounds of these magnificent creatures. The Olive Ridley Turtle is the smallest and most abundant of all sea turtles found across the world and is known to inhabit the warm waters of the Pacific, Atlantic and Indian Oceans.

Despite their abundance, they face numerous threats, including habitat loss, poaching, and accidental capture in fishing nets.

The turtle walk saw volunteers from Sattvic Soul Foundation and Youth4Water Plus come together to patrol the beach, monitoring the nesting sites of Olive Ridley Turtles and protecting the eggs and hatchlings from predators. The initiative highlights the importance of community-led conservation efforts in protecting our environment and the biodiversity that sustains it.



Overall, the *turtle walk* was a success and serves as an example of how collaboration and community engagement can help protect endangered species and their habitats. The efforts of the Sattvic Soul Foundation and Youth4Water Plus are a testament to the power of collective action in creating positive change for our planet's biodiversity.

#### # PanTISS Foundation & PAGA

Youth4Water Plus partnered with PanTISS Foundation and PAGA to engage more than 150 youth for Y20 Youth Choupals in remote tribal villages Nagada (Jajpur district), Mangalajodi, (Khurda district) and Kudupakia (Kandhamal district).



The youth shared their experiences of extreme climate events, poor plastic waste management, youth livelihoods vs marine diversity, sanitation around water bodies, wetlands and in villages, forest fires and climate migration. They discussed on how to sensitize communities, fight forest fires and also demonstrated their action orientation through a plogging activity to collect and recycle waste.


Youth participants enthusiastically expressed their personal journey with Youth4Water Plus and outlined
